1. (I) An average polar bear can travel more than 1,800 miles (2,896 kilometres) in a year migrating to follow a food supply. (II) Polar bears live in the Arctic, near the North Pole. Penguins live on Antarctica and the neighbouring continents, near the South Pole. (III) When travelling across the ice, polar bears can jump over ice cracks as wide as 19 feet (5.8 meters)! Polar bears are the only bear species to be considered marine mammals, as they spend most their time on the sea ice. (IV) Their skin is actually black. (V) The only reason why they appear white is because their fur is translucent and reflects the light, making them appear white.

2. (I) Coconut grenades were a weapon used in World War 2 by the Japanese in which a coconut was filled with items most importantly a grenade, and then thrown at the enemy. (II) Coconut oil has emerged over the years as a shining example of the food as medicine concept, with its unique combination of fatty acids, antioxidants, and anti-inflammatory properties. (III) Coconuts, in different forms, are anti-viral, anti-fungal, anti-bacterial and anti-parasite. (IV) Coconut water on average contains 94% water with around 46 calories a cup. (V) On average, three and a half cups of coconut equate to 1 tbsp. (25 grams) of fibre. This is the recommended daily amount of fibre an adult should have.

(IV) Fat cells are much harder for the body to break down if you are dehydrated. By remembering to have a glass of water, around thirty minutes before eating a meal, the body will be hydrated, and therefore the fat cells will be easier to break down. (V) Another positive of having a glass of water before a meal, is that generally your body doesn't need so much food which in turn will help with losing weight!

(IV) This is very good news for those who make a whole pot of coffee and drink it up every day. (V) Coffee containing caffeine can cause insomnia, nervousness and restlessness, stomach upset, nausea and vomiting, increased heart and breathing rate, and other side effects.

(IV) For example, the theory posits that black holes exist, and that each of these gravitational monsters has an event horizon — a point of no return beyond which nothing, not even light, can escape. (V) The universe has been around for roughly 13.7 billion years, but it still holds many mysteries that continue to perplex astronomers to this day.
